Enrollment in Two Schools

When one school doesn't meet all their needs, a family may choose to enroll in two schools that accept ESA+ funding. For instance, a student who thrives in their current private school may also need a school that specializes in learning disabilities. Another family may decide that a combination of home school and private school is the best option for their student.

The ESA+ program offers enrollment options that enable families to personalize their student's education. These include full-time private school, full-time home school, or co-enrollment in two schools. To learn more about your school options, visit "Choosing a School" on the ESA+ website.

ESA+ Enrollment Options

- 1 private school
- 1 home school
- 1 private school + 1 private school (co-enrollment)
- 1 private school + 1 public school* (co-enrollment, reduced award)
- 1 home school + 1 public school* (co-enrollment, reduced award)
- 1 home school + 1 private school (co-enrollment)

^{*}Co-enrollment in a public school depends on the policies of the local public school district.
