Considerations: Timing and Availability of Funds

Students who attend a nonpublic school:

 May have funds remaining to use for summer expenses after ESA+ has paid fall and spring tuition.

Students who attend a home school:

• May have funds remaining to use for summer expenses after making purchases and paying approved providers throughout the school year.

Note: If a student's ESA+ funds all go toward tuition, or if a parent with a home school spends the annual amount through the year, there will not be 2023-24 funds left to use for summer expenses!



Things to consider when thinking about using funds for summer 2024:



- Remaining funds
- Timing
- Use of funds



- a separate company that SEAA contracts with
- an online platform that hosts the electronic account on behalf of the ESA+ Program
- where ESA+ families use scholarship funds to:
 - \rightarrow make a payment to a service provider
 - \rightarrow purchase products that are ESA+ Allowable Expenses







ClassWallet access: timing considerations



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Each summer, ESA+ access to ClassWallet will shut down (for fiscal-year-end reporting) for several weeks beginning in mid-June.

Plan to make final purchases for the year before June 3!

Tip: If you try to make a purchase at the last minute, you won't have time to reorder if the item is unavailable.



Therapists and tutors are <u>providers</u>. Schools or entities that provide summer learning experiences are also <u>providers</u>.

Providers must be registered with and approved by the ESA+ Program.

Registration Process to Become a Provider

The Education Student Accounts Program (ESA+) registers providers to receive direct electronic payments from families for <u>allowable expenses</u>. This process is for **individuals or facilities** that provide tutoring or teaching services and educational therapies (service providers) and companies that sell curriculum (product providers). North Carolina law requires that providers paid with ESA+ funds be qualified.

This process is not for schools.

Step 1: Submit Provider Registration Request and Create Account

Visit the <u>Provider Portal</u> to register as a provider (for the purposes of this process, a provider may be referred to as a vendor).

Step 2: Submit Required Documents

Once you have created your provider account you will be asked to submit the required documents listed below.

- ESA+ Facility or Individual Provider Agreement (available through the Provider Portal)
- Provider Credentials

The provider must register themselves, but the parent may want to encourage them to do so, or explain the process.



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If a provider has not started the registration process by March 1, 2024, parents will <u>not</u> be able to pay that provider for summer services.





Rollover of Funds: *timing considerations*

- 1. \$9,000 awardees have until approximately June 3 to spend 2023-24 ESA+ funds.
- 2. \$17,000 awardees can roll over up to \$4,500 of their 2023-24 funds to use in the summer or through the next year.

What Can I Pay for with ESA+ Funds?

Families can use their ESA+ funds to pay for:

- Tuition and fees for a private school
- Certain services related to educating a child with disabilities
- Certain products related to educating a child with disabilities, including curricula and textbooks.
 - Curricula and textbook purchases must be related to one of the following academic subjects: math, science, English/language arts, social sciences, or foreign languages.

Products and services must be purchased through the <u>ClassWallet</u> platform.

Allowable Expenses

✓ Tuition and Fees

✓ <u>Tutoring</u>

- Educational Therapy
- ✓ <u>Curricula</u>
- ✓ Educational Technology
- ✓ Transportation ESA+ funds may be used for transportation to/from educational services or activities. Visit the <u>Search for a Provider portal</u> and enter the search term "transportation" to see a list of registered providers.
- Textbooks Must be required by a nonpublic school and related to one of the following academic subjects: math, science, English/language arts, social studies, or foreign languages.

Use of Funds During the Year or for the Summer

Qualified Products

- Curricula for academic subjects
- Textbooks
- Educational Technology

Qualified Services

- Tutoring/Teaching
 Services for academic subjects
- Educational Therapies



Summer learning experiences must be offered by a provider who has successfully registered with ESA+.



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Direct Payment Schools are required to register with ESA+ in order to be paid as a provider. *This policy is new; effective for summer 2024.*

Tip: Plan ahead for 2024 summer learning experiences. Check that your providers are successfully registered with ESA+ before March, to be sure.



Summer Learning Experiences

- 1. Summer services must be paid for by June 3.
- 2. Summer services may be tutoring, therapies, academic programs, or other summer learning experiences.
- 3. Like all approved services, summer experiences must be:
 - Therapeutic
 - Academic



- or
- Designed specifically for students with special needs

Tip: Many traditional summer camps are not a qualified expense.

Services that take place in June/July/August must be paid for in full by June 3.





Refunds must be returned to ESA+ via ClassWallet. Contact ESA+ via email to ask for help regarding funds to be returned.

Note too that funds returned after the end of the fiscal year (June 30 each year) are not returned to a parent's account.







Home School Families: Will you need Curricula before September next year?

Make plans early, and plan to purchase before June 3!



Parents should check MyPortal once a week:

- Are there items on the To Do list?
- Look at Notifications. Maybe you've missed an email!

ESA+ students need updated documentation of a disability **every 3 years** (*3 years from the evaluation date on file*).

HOWEVER: Parents, you will renew annually so that the ESA+ staff know you want your student to continue next year.

ESA+ is **not a reimbursement** program.

- Very few exceptions (mainly the ESA+ Reimbursement Schools)
- Do not purchase items or pay for services with the intent to submit a receipt.

Public School? If a student will be in the public school, full-time, as normally assigned, then they are **not eligible for ESA+**.

ESA+ is not permitted to provide funds to students who are enrolled in their regular public school (including charter schools).
